

Plateau State University set to build a Multi-Purpose Dam to serve both University and Host Community.

Vice Chancellor plateau state university BOKKOS, Professor Shedrack Best, has disclosed that, a multi-purpose dam that will serve both University and host community will be built.

Professor Best made this known during a tour of ongoing projects on campus .





The dam, which is expected to trap water from a shallow stream that runs across the university's east and west sides, is intended to provide water for irrigation and other activities.

According to Professor Best, the dam to be sited on the northeastern edge of the university would supply the university's

farms as well as residents of the host community. In addition to providing a vital water source, the dam would also act as a natural barrier, enhancing the security of students, staff, and university property.





To prepare for the project, which is scheduled to begin at the end of the current raining season, Professor Best has established a community relations team led by the Deputy Vice Chancellor Administration which will liaise with land owners in the designated area to ensure crops are harvested and fields are cleared in a timely manner, preventing any potential conflicts.

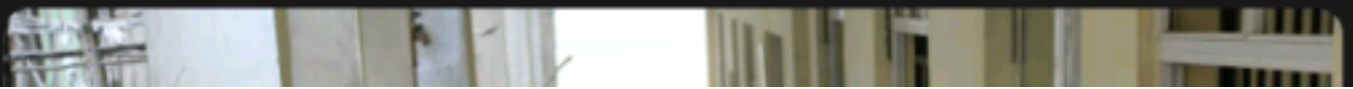




The team is expected to also interface with local committee set up by the host community's leadership in addressing grey areas.

Accompanied by the university's Registrar, Yakubu Ayuba, and other officials inspected several sites including various crop farms, the perimeter fence,

and the ongoing new Mass
Communication Department building,
which is at 95% completion.
